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APPLICATION FOR ACCREDITING ENTITIES FOR QUALITY LEVEL ASSIGNMENT

PHILOSOPHY

Colorado Shines QRIS began in the Fall of 2014, including a new brand name. There are five quality levels from Level 1 to Level 5, considered a hybrid of the block and points systems. Levels 1 and 2 are based on the block system, while levels 3 - 5 are based on a points system. The hybrid structure for Colorado Shines indicates levels of quality and support programs with a variety of ways to meet identified quality levels. Additionally, the Environmental Rating Scales (ERS) are incorporated into Colorado's QRIS.

In most rating systems, accreditation is included as a measure of quality for ratings. In some states, accreditation stands in for a rating in the quality system and no further evidence of quality is required. In other states accreditation is required to meet the highest level in the QRIS.

In Colorado, accepted accreditation programs will be included in Levels 3 and 4 based on their submitted crosswalk data. Colorado Shines requires accredited programs to demonstrate not only verification of their current accreditation status but show evidence that the program meets additional specific Colorado Shines standards.¹ Programs wishing to pursue Level 5 will need to apply to be rated by a qualified Colorado Shines assessor by submitting an application to be evaluated.²

Additionally, Colorado Shines Workforce Qualifications and Professional Development requirements must be met at each QRIS level, regardless of a program's accreditation status. The Workforce Qualifications and Professional Development and the staff professional development plans will be verified by the Colorado Professional Development Information System (PDIS). Therefore, all staff qualifications and the staff PD plans within the PDIS are not included as part of the accreditation application process.

Once an accrediting institution is approved for participation at Level 3 or Level 4, Colorado licensed Early Education programs will submit an application after completing the required activities in Colorado's PDIS.³

REVIEW COMMITTEE

An application review committee has been established and includes representatives from the Colorado Office of Early Childhood (OEC), the Colorado Department of Education (CDE), and Qualistar Colorado. The Committee has substantive expertise in early childhood education, quality improvement, and school district operations. The committee's role is to review applications and make recommendations to the OEC about approval and the QRIS level a school district program will receive, provided the program meets the stated requirements. CRITERIA

All accrediting institutions applying to be a recognized as an accrediting organization under Colorado Shines must satisfactorily meet all the criteria listed below. Applications must describe how they meet the criteria listed below and submit supporting documentation as described below:

Criteria I: Fiscal and Administrative Capability for Administering an Accrediting Process (5 page maximum)

A. Demonstrated fiscal and administrative capability

Describe in sufficient detail the organizational capacity for administering an accreditation program (support documents may be included such as the most recent audit or annual financial report, current operating budget, organizational chart, staff resources, job descriptions, etc.)

B. A nationally established program

A national accreditation program must be established for at least three (3) years and oversee accredited programs in multiple states. Documents of how long the program has been in existence, the number of accreditation visits conducted and the number of currently accredited programs nationally and in Colorado. The accreditation program must serve at least one (1) program in the state of Colorado to be considered.

C. <u>Verifiable</u>, public listing of accredited programs

Indicated how and where the accrediting body maintains a verifiable, current, public listing of accredited programs.

Criteria II: Administrative Policies and System Evaluation Procedures (10 page maximum)

A. Administrative Policies

Administrative policies and system evaluation procedures are in place to avoid conflicts of interest and address issues such as deferred status, withdrawal of accreditation, appeal processes, and complaints.

B. Validation/Assessment

Describe the academic qualifications and formal training requirements of the applicant's staff by the accrediting group.

C. Continuous Improvement/Quality Assurance

Peer-reviewers, training procedures, and instruments used in the process are evaluated for reliability and validity. Describe process and frequency.

Criteria III: Accreditation Process (15 page maximum)

Describe the accreditation process including the following components:

A. <u>Self Evaluation</u>

Accreditation program has a comprehensive self-evaluation that includes parents, staff, and program administrators, and that promotes program improvement. Describe.
