SAINTS ONLINE GUIDE TO BUYING SCHOOL TEXTBOOKS FROM FOLLETT VIRTUAL BOOKSTORES

While cost is certainly a critical factor when selecting your textbooks for next year, I would like to make you aware of a few additional pieces of information to ensure that you have a positive and productive shopping experience.

As a reminder, The St. Augustine online bookstore provider is Follett and you can find the link to our bookstore on the front of the school website, www.sahs.org. There you will find a tab on the right-hand side of the page that reads "Follett Virtual Bookstores." Click on this link and you will be directed to the St. Augustine bookstore.

The others in the marketplace...

While other online providers (Amazon, Barnes & Noble, EBay, etc.) do sell textbooks, they do not have a contractual relationship with St. Augustine High School and this is where problems may arise for you. If you purchase a book from a provider other than Follett, there is no guarantee with respect to condition, correct edition, buy-back, and other various customer service concerns. You are essentially "rolling the dice" on these matters and this did cause problems for a number of Saints families last school year. Follett provides St. Augustine a "buy-back" program and guarantees the condition and correct edition of any textbook you purchase or rent.

St. Augustine requests that Follett make available each and every textbook or resource

AUGUSTINIAN HERITAGE INFLUENCE OF AUGUSTINE'S WRITING THROUGH THE YEARS

Augustine was appreciated during his lifetime for the great value to Christianity that his writings possessed. This appreciation continued after his death, and is still with us today. The "City of God," the Augustinian work second only to the "Confessions" in the esteem in which it is held, gave much inspiration to the Holy Roman Empire, although Augustine would have been dismayed at this excessively secular understanding of his insights.

With the rise of the great universities of Europe, Augustine's style of thought and his ideas were held in high regard. Saint Thomas Aquinas, who gave Christian theology the benefit of a meticulous Aristotelian foundation, quoted Augustine more than 1000 times in the "Summa Theologica."

Scholars can trace the influence of Augustine upon the thought that inspired and followed the Renaissance; this is so with men such as Erasmus, Luther and Calvin, who turned more to Augustine than to any other early Doctor or Father of the Church. In the documents of the Second Vatican Council, more quotations were taken from Augustine than from any other non-Scriptural source. He is credited with an authority that is second only to the New Testament and to the official pronouncements of the Church.

The personal greatness of Augustine was akin to that of any saint, canonized or not. It lay in the ultimate unity of

DR. JERRY REY ('70) JOINS KEY COLLEGE BOARD PROGRAM

NEW YORK – In addition to his duties on the Saints Faculty, Dr. Gerald Rey was recently honored to participate in the academically prestigious College Board's Annual AP Reading in Economics program. Each June, AP teachers and college faculty members from around the world gather in the U.S. to evaluate and score the free-response sections of the AP Exams.

AP Readers are high school and college educators who represent many of the finest academic institutions in the world. The AP Reading is a unique forum in which an academic dialogue between educators is both fostered and encouraged. "The Reading draws upon the talents of some of the finest teachers and professors that the world has to offer," said Trevor Packer, Senior Vice President, AP and College Readiness at the College Board. "It fosters professionalism, allows for the exchange of ideas, and strengthens the commitment to students and to teaching. We are very grateful for the contributions of talented educators like Dr. Rey."

The Advanced Placement Program® (AP®) enables willing and academically prepared students to pursue college-level studies – with the opportunity to earn college credit, advanced placement or both – while still in high school. Through AP courses in 34 subjects, each culminating in a rigorous exam, students learn to think critically, construct solid arguments, and see many sides of an issue – skills that prepare them for college and beyond. Research indicates that students who score a 3 or higher on an AP Exam typically experience greater academic success in college and are more likely to earn a college degree than non-AP students.



in as many formats as possible to provide you with as many choices as possible. Textbooks may be available to you as "new", "used", "rental", or "digital" (for tablet or laptop). We encourage you to select the format that works best for your son and your budget; however, if you select a digital version, you MUST READ THE DETAILS carefully as most digital versions come with an expiration date whereby the student is unable to access the textbook after so many days have passed. A majority of the digital textbooks expire after 180 days, after which you must repurchase the digital version for another 180 days.

The textbook companies refer to this as a digital book's "term of use." This "term of use" is established by the publishers, NOT Follett or St. Augustine High School. You should also be cautious as the 180 day "term of use" begins from the moment you purchase the digital version and this includes weekends and holidays. Therefore, a digital textbook or resource might be a more viable option for semester courses as opposed to those that are year-long. This information is not meant to necessarily steer you away from purchasing a digital textbook or resource as there are many interactive features that come with this version; however, you should be aware of the "fine print."

The shipping and receiving...

Our friends at Follett utilize shipping carriers such as FedEx and UPS, just as we might when sending a package. As such, Follett tries to bundle your order in limited shipments to maximize your satisfaction with the delivery experience. However, if a text or resource is not available when you place your order, please advise Follett that you would like them to ship the available materials at that time. This will ensure that you will receive your materials in a timely fashion. It is also critical to note that Follett will not ship to a Post Office Box (domestic or international). You must use a United States street address to guarantee delivery. If you are unable to meet this criterion, you may have your order sent to St. Augustine High School.

A final note...

I encourage you to visit and explore our online bookstore in advance of you placing your order so that you can familiarize yourself with the wealth of information located on the site. Our bookstore has more detailed information on the topics referenced in this article as well as helpful links to a host of additional resources.

ST. AUGUSTINE MEDAL ADDRESS



being and his work. He possessed to a pre-eminent degree that union of mind and heart of which his monastic Rule speaks. No matter what his activity, Augustine was living not for himself alone, but centered everything upon Christ. He wrote that Jesus was the Source of his tremendous creative power: "When I am bowed down by my load, I am equally lifted up by Your love."

Augustine's nature was uncommon in its sensitivity, his perspicacity uncommon in its penetration, and his need to love uncommon in its depth. The individual stamp that Augustine's personality gave to his greatness was his "Umanita", his warmth of character. This human quality was the most arresting aspect of his genius and the clearest explanation of his influence upon every subsequent century.

In Augustine we do not encounter a saint who is featureless and plaster cast, but one who can be appreciated as a warm and human person, with a passionate heart aflame with the love of God, a restless heart driving him to search out lasting truth, and a sensitive heart that desired for the Christian community all that was good. People of all ages can join Augustine when in his 'Confessions' he wrote: "...Lord, hear my prayer . . . that I should find more delight in You than in all the temptations that once distracted me, that I should love You more intensely and hold on to Your Hand with all my heart's strength, and that I be delivered from evil to the end of my days..."

plus Mexico and Scotland.

One hundred nine will stay close to home by enrolling at a UC or Cal State school in California and 15 are headed to Northern Arizona University. Thirty-four will attend a Catholic college. Gonzaga for example will land seven, USD five and Marquette and Villanova four.

This year several will be attending military oriented institutions in the fall such as The Citadel, California Maritime, U.S. Naval Academy and the U.S. Air Force Academy.

While Saintsmen will be enrolling in big name schools like USC, Notre Dame, MIT, New York University, Boston College, Loyola/Chicago, and the prestigious journalism school at the University of Missouri/Columbia, many will be attending smaller name colleges like Siena, Tufts, Stetson, Linfield, and Manhattan.

In terms of scholarships, the Class of 2013 has earned more than \$2.79 million with new scholarship reports coming in every week—by Nancy Caine.
