

Key Individual Tax Policies from the Trump Tax Cuts Set to Expire for Wyoming Constituents

Tax Hikes Looming for <u>Wyoming Residents</u> on December 31, 2025:

- Wyoming is home to **389,620** taxpayers.
- The average taxpayer in Wyoming would see a 24% tax hike if the Trump Tax Cuts expire.
- A family of 4 making \$72,415, the median income in Wyoming, would see a \$1,449 tax increase if the Trump Tax Cuts expire.
 - This is worth about **7 weeks**



of groceries to a typical family of 4 in the region.
